Charges Filed

An animal exhibitor, with headquarters in Westland, Mich., has been served with a 15 count charge that he violated the Animal Welfare Act. The USDA says that Walter D. Mayer's facilities were inspected on four different occasions and deficiencies were found during each visit.

The charges include eleven counts that allege violations including inadequate storage of feed and bedding, cleaning, repairs and trash disposal, and an inadequate number of trained caretakers for the animals. USDA charges also include that monkey houses and cages were poorly

Every act was excellent and the wardrobe was fresh-looking and in good taste. The Villams were truly outstanding with their lightning fast juggling and acrobatics, and never missed a trick. Five clean and neatly dressed clowns appeared several times, but were not identified by name, but they deserve lots of credit.

The Prince Najvez act concludes with several bursts of fireworks and the dense smoke hung over the seats during the 15 minutes of intermission. Many in the audience complained because it bothered them and their children. The irony of it is that a half dozen announcements are made during the show that "No Smoking Is Allowed In the Building."

A Mall Show

The Circus International, owned and operated by Gary and Trude (Luvass) Strong, was caught during its three day engagement at the fashionable Valley Mall in Hagerstown, Md. (May 13-15).

A stage with tent-style backdrop and a ring in front provides the setting. "Footlight" style color lighting is used, running full circle, inside the ring curb and other color lighting effects are integrated into the stage and backdrop.

Props for Madame Trude Luvass Poodle Fantasy are mirrored, the dogs well-groomed, and the act has the immediate approval of small-fry who, with their mothers make up the bulk of daytime audiences.

Gary Strong, ringmaster for circuses in the past, takes up the same duties here, announcing and pacing the program, also doing juggling, rope spinning, whip cracking, etc. A young man, Cleo, interjects the performance with European-style clowning, magic, featuring doves, flowers and silks, and makes an appearance as the Little Kid in a serio-comic trapeze specialty.

Bullfighters will attend from Spain, Mexico, Argentina and South America. Called "Hispanic Cultural Festival" the event will be without bloodshed and a pageantry of beauty, splendor, music and dancing in the Spanish and Latin traditions.

Bullfighting will be held at the Long Beach Arena Sept. 24-26, and Howard W. Suesz, former circus producer, is arranging additional dates throughout the U.S. He already has several promotional staffs at work.

Cats Return

The return of tigers, jaguars and cougars, a 20 year old female lion trainer and an all new look have been announced for Jungle Larry's Circus Africa set to open at Cedar Point in Sandusky (Ohio) next month. Winter construction at the park has provided many changes, and now guests will enter the animal show area by means of a themed walk-up entrance way.

"After a three year ban restricting the moving of spotted and striped cats, an amendment to the Endangered Species Act will allow us to bring a tiger show back to Cedar Point," says Larry.

This year Larry will be presenting some of the exotic animals, plus a monkey, lion and elephant working together. The tigers will be presented by Roy Wells, while Ms. Pat White will present a group of full-grown lions. Two chimp shows will be worked by Larry and Roy.

"We will have more shows this year than any other year, which we feel is what our guests want," Larry added.

maintained, that pens for deer and a cougar were inadequately drained, and that lions were kept outdoors without protection from the elements.

Other charges state that on Feb. 9, Mr. Mayer had an exhibit at a Livonia, Mich., shopping center and that not enough drinking water was available. It was also charged that veterinary care for monkeys was allegedly inadequate. On Feb. 10, at an exhibition for the Luthern School for the Deaf, in Detroit, it was charged Mr. Mayer failed to keep proper separation between the viewing public and exhibited animals, which constituted a safety hazard.

Mr. Mayer is entitled to a oral hearing and is considered innocent unless he admits to the charges or is found guilty by a federal judge. Possible penalty is an order to cease and desist from further violations. Violation of such an order is punishable by a \$500 fine for each day a violation continues.

In the late 20's he retired to enter the carnival concession business, operating waffle stands until 15 years ago. At age 92 he was still able to ride a unicycle.
